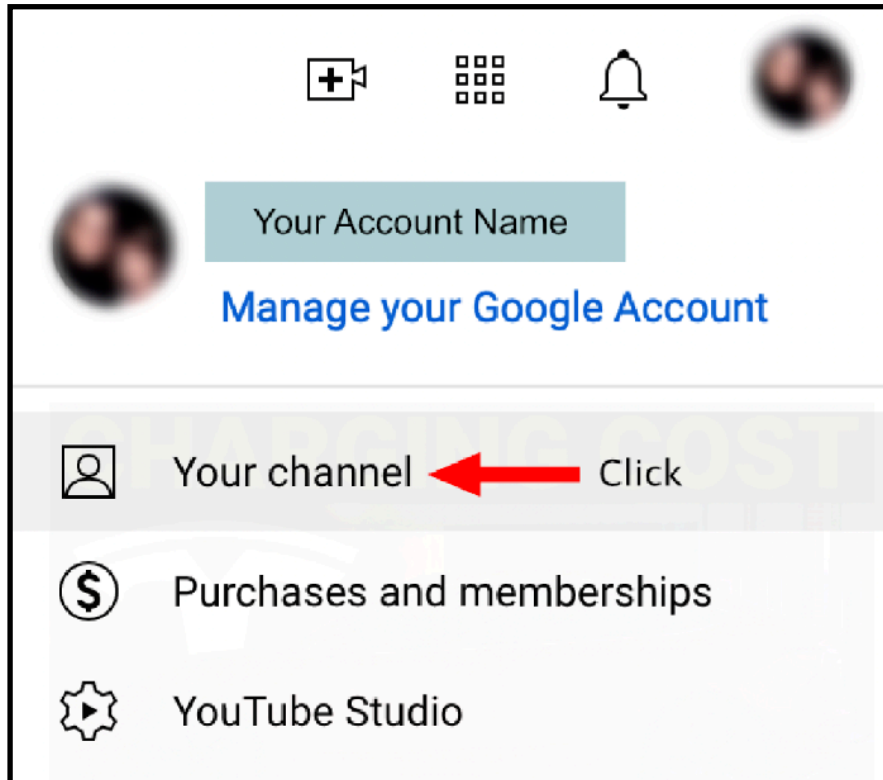
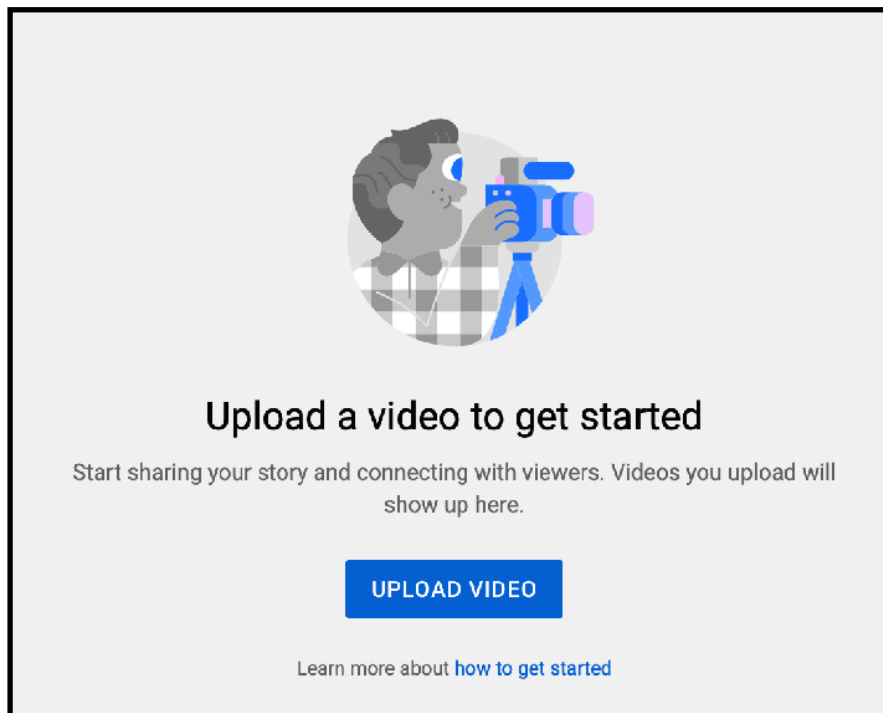


Uploading a Digital Movie File to YouTube
